TRANSPORT POLICY

This policy lays down the club's approach to travel arrangements for cricket matches. Generally, our approach means that parents are responsible for transportation to and from games and practice sessions. By signing their child's membership/registration form parents/carers give permission for children to participate in all competitions and away fixtures/events.

Away Fixtures

1. The managers/coach of the respective teams will inform parents/carers of the date, arrival time, and venue of the game and finish time.
2. It is the parent or carer's responsibility to make the necessary arrangements for their child to get to the venue for the stated time, either by transporting their own child or making arrangements with other parents.
3. It is the parent or carer's responsibility to make the necessary arrangements for their child to be returned from the venue to home by, transporting their own child or making arrangements with other parents.
4. The respective team manager/coach will undertake to check at the end of a game that all children have been collected. In the event of arrangements breaking down, the team manager will attempt to contact the parent/carer and agree a new arrangement.
5. Should the team manager/coach be unable to make any contact they will take responsibility for ensuring that the child is returned
6. Any transport provided by club officials will be in "exceptional circumstances" and deemed to be "with parental consent" and "without liability".

Home Fixtures & Practice Sessions

1. It is the parent or carer's responsibility to make the necessary arrangements for their child to get to the venue for the stated time, either by transporting their own child or making arrangements with other parents.
2. It is the parent or carer's responsibility to make the necessary arrangements for their child to be returned from the venue to home by, transporting their own child or making arrangements with other parents.

Open Play Cricket

1. It is good practice that for any children playing adult cricket games being transported to a match, where possible, there should be more than one other person in the vehicle with them. Where this is not possible, coaches, managers and/or adult players should seek parental consent before transporting any young cricketers on their own.
